THE POSITION

This is an at-will, regular, full-time position that has responsibility for providing professional dental care to our mobile dental clinic patients. The incumbent will travel throughout El Dorado County in our new dental program van utilizing his/her examining and diagnosing dental conditions and oversee a variety of professional dental care and treatment activities to ensure appropriate dental health standards and practices are maintained.

The incumbent will be required to reside in South Lake Tahoe twelve weeks per year for which he/she will receive a \$250 weekly housing per diem.

THE COMMUNITY

Stretching from the foothills above the Sacramento Valley through rugged mountains to Lake Tahoe, the "Golden County" of California has a terrain as diverse as its population.

El Dorado County with a population of 179,000 is the heart of the most diversified recreational area in California, with approximately one million acres of national forest land. There is a wealth of history and a wide variety of recreational choices providing something for everyone. These choices may include gold panning at nearby Marshall Gold Discovery Site in Coloma, whitewater rafting on the American River, Nordic and alpine skiing in the Sierras, camping, fishing, mountain biking, and, well, you name it.

Visitors and locals alike enjoy the many local wineries that have become famous in El Dorado County as well as Apple Hill for its farms, bake shops, and breweries.

High per capita income along with low crime rates, and excellent schools have attracted many new families and businesses to this desirable destination.

TRIBAL HEALTH PROGRAM

The U.S. Government purchased the Shingle Springs Rancheria in 1920 for the occupancy of the Sacramento/Verona Band of Homeless Indians. It is the descendants of those Indians who have made today's clinic available to serve our community's health needs with medical, dental and mental health services, and community outreach programs since 1995.

Our program prides itself in providing a warm, caring and welcoming environment that respects and supports Native American traditions, values, ethics and beliefs. The clinic believes that modern medicine and traditional medicine are unique to the healing of all who seek our professional services.

The Tribal Health Program in conjunction with First 5 of El Dorado County has recently established a mobile dental health program. Our dental program van travels throughout El Dorado County offering screenings, cleanings, fillings, and sealants to children from birth to age 18. Its patient population is mainly children who are covered by Medicaid or have limited or no dental insurance.

THE IDEAL CANDIDATE

The ideal candidate will be an experienced dentist (preferably pediatric); be able to work independently; have a high degree of professional judgment, integrity and initiative; have an understanding of socio-economic and psycho-social factors affecting the wellness and treatment of public health, and other high risk infants, children and adolescents; and demonstrate tact, diplomacy, patience and compassion.

Education/Experience

- Graduation from an accredited college or university dental program.
- Two years of general dentistry experience (preferably pediatric).

License/Certification

- Possession of a valid license to practice dentistry issued by the California State Board of Dental Examiners.
- Possession of a valid certificate of examination for Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR).
- Possession of a valid certificate of examination for Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS).
- Possession of a valid Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) number.
- Possession of a valid National Provider Identifier (NPI).
- Possession of a valid California class C driver's license and be insurable by the employer's Auto Insurance Policy.

Desired

- Bilingual - Spanish

Preference in hiring is given to: (1) Qualified Shingle Springs Rancheria members; and (2) Qualified American Indian in accordance with Title 25, U.S. Code, Section 472 and 473. Applicants claiming Indian preference must submit verification of Indian eligibility.
